Perspective – Windows 10 is 10 Years Old What has happened to *Automobiles* in the Past 10 Years

- In the past 10 Years ... automobiles have seen significant advancements in safety features, enhancing both driver assistance and occupant protection. Key developments include:
- Advanced Driver-Assistance Systems (ADAS):
 - Automatic Emergency Braking (AEB): Detects potential collisions and applies brakes automatically to prevent or mitigate impacts.
 - Lane-Keeping Assist: Monitors vehicle position within lanes and provides steering inputs to prevent unintentional drifting.
 - Blind Spot Warning and Intervention: Alerts drivers to vehicles in adjacent lanes and can intervene to prevent lane-change collisions.
 - **Pedestrian Detection and Braking:** Identifies pedestrians in the vehicle's path and applies brakes to avoid accidents.

You'd be Safer in a New Car Than in a 10-year-old Car

First question to ask yourself Do I really NEED Windows?

In other words,

Do I use any software that only runs on the Windows OS:

E.g. Quicken for finances

Adobe Photoshop for photo editing

Etc.

Or do I do all my computing using:

A Browser (Chrome, Firefox, etc.) e.g. Banking, Finance, etc.

Office functions (Word, Excel, etc.)

Email (via Browser)

If the latter, you may not even need Windows!

Most of What You Do Happens in a Web Browser

- A modern web browser is essentially a mini operating system itself, and you can even run applications in it or access them via the cloud.
- Cloud based apps like Google Docs and free office suites can do a lot

You're Not a PC Gamer (and Even Then)

- If you don't play video games on your computer, then Linux (or any number of alternatives) will likely serve you just as well.
- On <u>Linux</u>, there have been major leaps in getting Windows games to run using compatibility layers


4 Signs You Don't Actually Need Windows

Your Apps Aren't Windows Exclusive

- Are the apps that you use on Windows only available in a Windows version?
- Alternatively, are there other equivalent apps that would run on something other than Windows that could do the same job?
- It might feel like you must stick with Windows simply because you rely on software that needs Windows, but in many cases this might not be true.

You Don't Use MS Subscription Services

- If you aren't using services like OneDrive or PC Game Pass
- If you aren't buying into those Microsoft value adds that Windows opens up to you, do you really need to stick with Windows at all?

- Windows continues to come under attack from all quarters
 - <u>Russian hackers</u>, the exploitation of <u>zero-day vulnerabilities in Windows</u> itself, Password hacking threats
- Keeping your operating system secure has never been more vital
- And ... security support for Windows 10 (a 10-Year-Old Operating System) ends on October 14 of This Year.
- A Jan. 21 posting to Microsoft's Windows release health support pages revealed that there is a way to get a legal upgrade to Windows 11 free of charge.

Current status as of January 21, 2025

<u>Windows 11, version 24H2</u> ☑, also known as the Windows 11 2024 Update, is now broadly available.

Starting this week, we are expanding this latest Windows version's phased rollout. We are gradually offering this update also to eligible devices running Windows 10, version 22H2.

If you have an eligible Windows 10 or Windows 11 device, you can check if the update is available by selecting **Settings** > **Windows Update** and selecting **Check for updates** . If your device is ready for the update, you'll see the option to **Download and install** Windows 11, version 24H2.

Devices running Home and Pro editions of Windows 11, versions 23H2 and 22H2 that are not managed by IT departments will receive the <u>update</u> automatically . Users can choose the time to restart . their device or <u>postpone the update</u>.

For Copilot+ PC devices, new features will continue rolling out in phases to select devices and markets in the Windows Insider community. Note that <u>availability may differ based on the various silicon platforms</u> .

How To Get Windows 11 For Free Before Windows 10 Support Ends

- The Security Dangers Facing Windows 10 Users Who Don't Take The Free Upgrade Option
 - Hack attacks, data loss, espionage and ransomware are going to be high on the list for many people
 - The most secure operating system yet, Windows 11, had been losing market share to Windows 10, which is, by definition, a less secure operating system.
 - Recently, the rate of Windows 10 to 11 conversion has been accelerating.
 - Windows 10 will soon become a very insecure operating system indeed as Microsoft has already announced end of support (no more security fixes for Windows 10 users).

How To Get Windows 11 For Free Before Windows 10 Support Ends

- To check if your Windows 10 device is eligible for the free Windows
 11 operating system upgrade then head for Settings > Windows
 Update and then select the check for updates option.
- If your device is ready for the update, you'll see the option to download and install Windows 11, version 24H2.

Windows 11 features: Some reasons to upgrade

A refreshed look

- Windows 11 keeps the **Taskbar** and **Start Menu**, but there's more than a whiff of **Apple's macOS influence** here.
- You'll get a **centered row of app icons** on the taskbar, **rounded window edges**, and other flourishes that make for a **cleaner**, **more appealing interface**.
- There's also a new widget feed.


Improved performance

- Windows **updates will be approximately 40% smaller** than they are currently and take place in the background, so there's **less room for interruption**.
- You can expect general performance enhancements across the board, too, including with web browsers (not just Edge).






Windows 11 features: Some reasons to upgrade

Big ecosystem changes

- The **Windows Store** in Windows 11 will open things up for all kinds of apps, even if they're not Universal Windows apps.
- Apps like Adobe's Creative Cloud will finally be available through the native Microsoft Store
- App makers can use their own in-app monetization systems and keep 100% of the revenue (More New Useful Windows 11 apps!)

Moving from Windows 10 to Windows 11? What's different, and how to adapt

- Windows 11 isn't as different from Windows 10 as it might seem at first glance.
- And what you can't get used to, you can often restore.
- It is easier than switching to Mac or Linux
- In many cases, these are fairly small changes that you can quickly get used to.
- In many cases, it's even possible to restore or mimic old behavior, and new additions you don't need can often be turned off or hidden.

Start11 V2 Brings More Start Menu Designs to Windows 11 & 10

- For \$9.99 Start11 allows you to customize your Windows 11 Start menu in various ways, including switching it back to the Windows 10 and even Windows 7 menus.

- 3. You can choose from multiple **Start Menu** choices
- 4 Chose whichever works best for you.
- 5. There are many configuration options.






















Stick with Windows 10?

- Ignore the end-of-support deadline completely
 - Just continue running your unsupported operating system and hope for the best.
 - That exposes you to the very real possibility that you'll fall prey to a security exploit.
 - Some think their antivirus software is sufficient that might be a bad bet!
 - If you're intent on doing this, think about buying add-on support
 - More later

The risks of staying with Windows 10 after End Of Life

- Security risks:
- Without security updates, Windows 10 will become increasingly vulnerable to new malware, ransomware, and zero-day exploits.
- Older operating systems are prime targets for cyberattacks since attackers know that security holes will never be patched.
 - Even if you use third-party antivirus software, it won't be enough to protect you from system-level vulnerabilities that Microsoft would have fixed.
- Disconnect If You Keep It: If you're not ready to part with your older PC, Microsoft advises disconnecting it from the internet before October 14th.

The risks of staying with Windows 10 after End Of Life

- No support from Microsoft:
- If you run into errors or system crashes, you will not be able to seek support from Microsoft.
 - You'll have to rely on online forums, outdated documentation, or third-party support services, which may not provide reliable fixes.
- Software and Hardware compatibility issues:
- As time passes, new software and hardware will be designed for Windows 11 and later versions, leaving Windows 10 users behind.
- You may find that essential applications stop working or that new hardware (such as printers, GPUs, or peripherals) lacks proper driver support for Windows 10.

Buy a new PC

- Microsoft and its partners would like you to replace that unsupported hardware with <u>a new PC</u>.
- You might even be tempted by one of the <u>shiny new Copilot+ PCs</u>, with their custom neural processing units, or maybe a <u>powerful gaming PC</u>.
- Some feel this is Microsoft's real goal.
- Microsoft tells Windows 10 users to just trade in their PC for a newer one, because how hard can it be?
 - Microsoft has a problem.
 - If <u>StatCounter</u> is to be believed, **58.7% of Windows users** have stuck to **Windows 10**, despite it losing support in just over half a year.

Microsoft Says: Buy a New PC with Window 11 Installed

- We're not sure how much money Microsoft thinks people can squeeze out of a trade-in for a Windows 10 machine.
- You'd probably get *more* value out of a Windows 10 machine by keeping it around versus selling it online or at a store.

- You could keep your old hardware and replace Windows 10 with the flavor of Linux you prefer. (Linux is Free)
- If you've got the technical knowhow and experience to manage the transition, that option is worth considering.
- Purchasing a Chromebook is an inexpensive alternative







- If you've ever considered making the jump to a different <u>operating</u> <u>system</u>, now is the perfect time.
- But if you don't want to pay more for a Mac, it's important to remember that there are options outside of the Windows-macOS binary—and you don't even have to settle for the browser-based ChromeOS.
- With a little patience and some command line acumen, you can turn to the world of Linux.
- It's easier to make the jump than you may think.




How to Install and Update Apps

- How you install and manage apps will be very different from what you're accustomed. In Linux,
- Each distro has its own repository—kind of like a free app store, with a directory of popular apps.
- You can install apps From a graphical software manager (which looks like an app store)
- Browse or search using the bar at the top.
- You will find **Linux versions of Windows software**, such as Steam and Spotify, or open-source alternatives to common apps, like **Banshee** in place of **iTunes** and **Gimp** instead of **Photoshop**.

Ditch Windows completely → Chromebook ←



- Forget Windows laptops, MacBooks, and iPads. If you want a fast, reliable, and secure laptop for cheap, get a Chromebook.
 - It'll be one of the best tech decisions you'll make.
- Whenever people are looking for a new laptop, their minds almost immediately go to Windows laptops or MacBooks, but there is a third classification that should be considered: Chromebooks.
- Chromebooks have grown into user-friendly laptops that you can productively use for both personal and business workflows.
- Since most of our work now happens within web browsers, Chromebooks offer a perfect marriage of simplicity and usability.

1. Chromebooks are cheap

- Finding an inexpensive piece of hardware can be a big plus for anyone looking to stay productive.
- You can purchase a very respectable Chromebook, such as the <u>ASUS</u> <u>Chromebook Flip C433 2 in 1</u> for \$204.99.
- Acer is selling its **Chromebook Plus 514** for \$353.00 on Amazon.

• 2. Chromebooks are user-proof

- ChromeOS' ease of use is light years ahead of the competition.
- No matter your experience level, you can sit down with a Chromebook and put it to use immediately.
- OS upgrades are something even grandparents can handle.

3. Chromebooks are fast

- It's not just about how quickly Android or Linux apps open but also how fast the machines boot.
- ChromeOS boots in a fraction of the time it takes any other operating system to boot.
- If you want a fast laptop at a reasonable price, get a Chromebook.

4. Chromebooks are reliable

• That's partly because ChromeOS is "mostly" a web browser masquerading as an OS, but even with Linux and Android app support enabled, you'll seldom have a problem.

5. Chromebooks are flexible

- Work done on a Chromebook is automatically saved onto Google's cloud servers.
- This leaves your on-device storage space free for whatever you want.
- For this reason, Chromebooks tend to have small SSDs -- Google figures everything will be saved on its servers.
- If you ever decide to upgrade your laptop, you won't have to transfer files to the new machine.
 - But: accessing files on the cloud requires constant internet access.
- Chromebook Plus laptops have solved this with the <u>File Sync</u> feature, which gives you offline access to your Google Drive accounts.
- You can do your work while away from a connection, and when you return home, the files are automatically uploaded to the cloud.

6. Chromebooks are secure

- Thanks to the Linux kernel, ChromeOS is a very secure option.
- Chromebooks are also secured with verification at boot, a read-only OS that blocks executables, data encryption, sandboxing, and more.
- In Chromebook's 10-year history, only 57 ChromeOS security exploits have been documented.
- You won't need antivirus or anti-malware. Just make sure to apply all updates when they become available, avoid suspicious websites, and only install extensions from the official Google Chrome Store.

• 7. Chromebooks can be easily restored

- Should you wind up having a problem with ChromeOS misbehaving (extremely unlikely), you can simply do a "powerwash" (a factory reset) and log back into your Google account.
- You'll find everything there, minus whatever problem you were experiencing (and anything you'd previously saved to the Downloads folder).
- No other operating system can compete with ChromeOS' ability to factory reset and return you to a pristine working state without losing your data, bookmarks, and apps.



If you can't upgrade to Windows 11... Option #4



- Pay Microsoft for security updates (Temporary 1 year)
 - Microsoft will indeed continue developing security updates for Windows 10, but they won't be free.
 - Microsoft <u>announced in December 2023 that it will offer</u> <u>Extended Security Options (ESUs) for Windows 10</u>
 - Home users can opt in for a single year of updates at \$30 per
 PC

- Extended Security Updates (ESU) program for Windows 10
 - https://learn.microsoft.com/en-us/windows/whats-new/extended-security-updates
- The Windows 10 Extended Security Updates (ESU) program gives customers the option to receive security updates for PCs enrolled in the program.
- To be eligible to install updates from the ESU program, devices must be running Windows 10, version 22H2.



Limitations

- ESUs doesn't include the following items:
 - New features
 - Customer-requested non-security updates
 - Design change requests
 - General support won't be provided for Windows versions past the end of support date.

How much does ESU cost?

 For individuals or Windows 10 Home customers, Extended Security Updates for Windows 10 will be available for purchase at \$30 for one year.

 - Opatch Explained: How It Works and What It Means for the End of Windows 10

 - If you must stick with Windows 10, consider installing the <u>third-party</u>
 <u>Opatch agent</u> to deal with any security issues that aren't addressed by Microsoft.
 - The free Opatch personal plan includes patches for known 0-day vulnerabilities, but if you want all Windows 10 patches, you'll need to pay for a Opatch Pro plan at a per-PC rate that equates to a few dollars a month.



- Want to keep using Windows 10? This company offers unofficial security patches — but it will cost you
 - They have previously been providing patches for Windows 7
 - There will be an annual fee announced later
 - Now offering up to 5 years of Patches for Windows 10
 - These are only Security patches
 - Your Applications will continue to age, and possibly fail in the future
 - No new upgrades for Windows 10 only Security

Upgrade your 'incompatible' hardware to Windows 11

- There are "officially" supported ways to bypass those restrictions.
 - You just must jump through a few **technical hoops**.

 - For PCs that were originally designed for Windows 10, you need to make one small <u>registry edit</u> and then make sure that your PC is configured to use **Secure Boot with the Trusted Platform Module (TPM)** enabled.
 - Even an old TPM 1.2 chip will do.
 - For older PCs that were originally designed for Windows 7 or Windows 8.1, you might need to use a third-party tool called Rufus to bypass installation challenges.

You may need help if you go this route!

Installing Windows 11 on old PCs is incredibly risky. Here's why

- You can run Windows 11 on just about any PC, but it doesn't mean you should.
 - The operating system won't behave the same across the board.
 - An update could rollout and break functionality severely, and you'd be stuck.
 - Microsoft could also choose to not push certain updates to incompatible PCs—which may include <u>security patches and features</u>.
 - Without fixes for zero-day vulnerabilities, hackers can exploit them in order to, say, take over your PC or add code that steals sensitive data (e.g., financial info).
 - Such outcomes can cost you real time and money.
